In the midst of all the good cheer, there were a few anxious moments. Our best wishes for a speedy recovery go to Lady Ælgifu after her hospitalisation and we hope that our wayfarers were not unduly delayed and inconvenienced by the volcano which had the temerity to erupt and disrupt peoples travel plans.

Now that Great Northern War is over, we hope to see a good number of our populace at Coronation. We are sure that this will be another great event and we look forward to seeing everyone there.

In the meantime, three things to think about and discuss:

One item of note from Great Northern War was that the lack of a Baronial Quartermaster and policies for the storage and loan of Baronial equipment added to the burden and stress on the Event Stewards. Make your lists and let us know what they are, so that we can use them to guide us in making GNW even better, either by helping you fulfil your personal wishes or by providing feedback to Countess Leonor, Event Steward for next year.

Lastly, it was suggested to us at Great Northern War that the Barony needs a Wayfarers Award - something to reward those who travel to the Barony regularly and who enrich it by doing so. We would ask everyone to consider this and let us know whether you believe it is a good idea, and suggest ideas for a name and badge.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO BECOME A CONSTABLE?

- 18 years or older (you need to be able to sign legal documents)
- Have knowledge of Corpora and Lochac Law
- Have knowledge of Local/State laws
- Follow the Guidelines as directed in this handbook
- Demonstrate common sense, lateral thinking and the ability to delegate.
- Demonstrate an attitude compatible with the duties of this office (i.e. be able to deal with difficult clients or people). And Be a member.

Your duties:

- The duties defined in law at this time require the Constable to fulfil five main roles:
- To be the Main Safety Officer at Events
- To Collect Indemnities As Required By Corpora
- Policing Mundanity
- The Maintenance Of Order And Good Conduct Amongst People At Events



- Administering Lost Property
- Additional duties is to train others in becoming Constables – we always need constables.

You have many Constables at Large rostered to help you – you do not have to do all events yourself. It is not a hard role but it is an important one in the SCA.

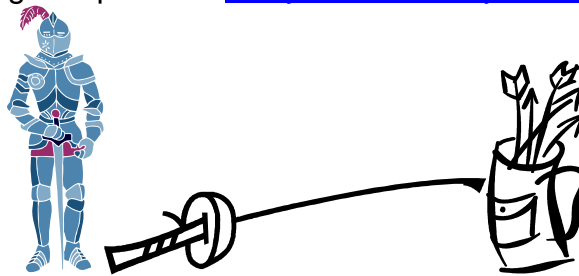

Documentation Tips for Arts & Science Competition Entries

#1 Tip: Keep It Simple Sweetheart – KISS RULE

Judges have bad light to read by generally and not a whole lot of time so a summary is a great way to start

#2 Tip: Relate your style or use of Documentation to your entry

It is different when entering a cooking / beverage comp to entering an article of clothing / footwear / armour to a research article. *Please find and read examples to see the difference.*

#3 Tip: Remember to include changes or substitutions you have made and why.

Example: "I used the ingredients of the period cordial as stated and made the drink but it was too thick or syrupy and the mint flavour was lacking. I made a second sample by using less sugar and used a stronger cottage mint and let it stew 10 mins longer. Result was a lighter, tastier drink."

#4 Tip: References, references, references. Good rule of thumb – 3, 3², 3³

Primary sources are best- something actually from the time period.

Examples woodcuts, Art painted in period, Harlein Ms, 'Forme of Currye', 'Curve on Ynglish', Pictures of actual preserved shoes/books/clothes/cutlery etc

Use 3 Primary sources to confirm existence.

Secondary sources can help with information, especially when primary sources are unavailable.

Use 3 secondary sources for every primary source (9)

Tertiary sources – A bit like "Chinese Whispers", not always reliable.

Use 3 tertiary sources for every secondary source.
