The Way We Were Here we are again at the end of another year, and another issue of Ductus. This has been a year of enormous change and growth for the College, and as I result of everyone's vision, support and sheer hard work the College is a leaner, meaner scribing machine for the next millenium, and an organisation we can all be very proud of.

To summarise these reforms:

Funding problems solved by procuring ongoing Principality funding. Delivery and damage problems solved by implementing postage policies Backlog trimmed to a workable size, and virtual elimination of AA backlog Turnaround time dramatically decreased by implementation of signature file Operations revision and streamlining, resulting in better data management and communications, and corresponding decrease in discrepancies (lost or duplicated scrolls)

There has been a great deal more behind-thescenes stuff, but these are the biggies. I would like to extend my thanks to the very hardworking membership of the College (and to those of you who have been slacking, I know where you live!), and am grateful for your feedback, support and confidence throughout the year; and I'm sure that together we can achieve even greater things in the coming year.

The Number of the Beast

Although of course still with us, the backlog has been well and truly tamed, which is a heroic feat by the scribes of Lochac-well done everyone! The breakdown of the available scrolls as of this date is as follows: AA: 17 (up 6 from June) AA with Leaf of Merit: 1 (no change) AA with Rose Leaf: 0 (no change) Grant of Arms: 2 (no change) GA with Royal Company of Archers: 1 (no change) GA with Royal Company of Yeomen: 0 (down 1 from June) Patent-KSCA: 8 (down 3 from June) Patent-OL: 19 (down 3 from June) Patent-OP: 35 (up 1 from June) Patent-Viscounty: 11 (down 1 from June)

Total: 94 (down 1 from June 2001, down from 205 June 2000)

Prepare a new charter for the operation on the College for presentation to the Crown of Lochac;

Create and print designs for the new Royal Patent Superblanks

Prepare 2002 edition of Scribe's Manual,

- including new scroll texts
- Design and register new Arms/badge for the College

I am seeking your feedback on all of these matters, and anything else you feel may affect the College. Please contact me with your input and have your say in building the College of our new Kingdom.

Scroll Shipping and Delivery

There are still some people (not naming names) who are insisting on getting scrolls to either myself or the West via an improbable chain of couriers. I am asking, begging, pleading for the love of God *do not do this! Please send all scrolls directly to me via registered post.*

Why do I say this? In my long experience with the college, far, far too many scrolls have gone missing by relying on couriers. They have proven unreliable time and again, which results in scrolls lost, delayed, missing or damaged. Given the hours of work that goes into every scroll, this is just not on. Since I instituted the policy of post, we have not lost a single scroll. If a scroll is sent via registered post, it is automatically insured, and tracked at every step of the way-that's the purpose of the barcode on the label, every time it goes through a postal bay, it gets scanned and registers on the post office computers, so if a scroll does go astray we can find it. If you do not wish to do, give your completed scroll to your local warden, and they will send it to me with the next batch.

Nor will I be accepting scrolls at events without prior arrangement. Scrolls and events are not mixy things: you have food, dust, mud, drink, any number of things that can irreparably damage a scroll. If you want to give me a scroll at an event, please email or call me first so that I can make arrangements to collect and transport it safely. I am not hard to get hold of, my email and phone details are in every issue of Pegasus and this newsletter.
